Classification of Songs in Philippine Music

a. Art Song – is one that meets the requirements of the musical and poetic arts.


b. Folk Song – is a song of the people and consists of simple melodic, harmonic, and metric fundamentals.

c. National Song – is one that belongs to the nation. The national anthem or hymn, with a martial theme, is a national song.



d. Popular Song – is a song of trivial musical and poetic value, usually written by laymen for popular mass appeal. It is a song of the people.

e. Strophic Song – is a folk art or art song consisting of two or more stanzas, each of them set to an identical tune.




f. Ballad – is a class of song particularly common in England and derived from ballata, a song with dance.

g. Plain Song – is a piece of unisonous vocal music popularly used in Christian church rituals.



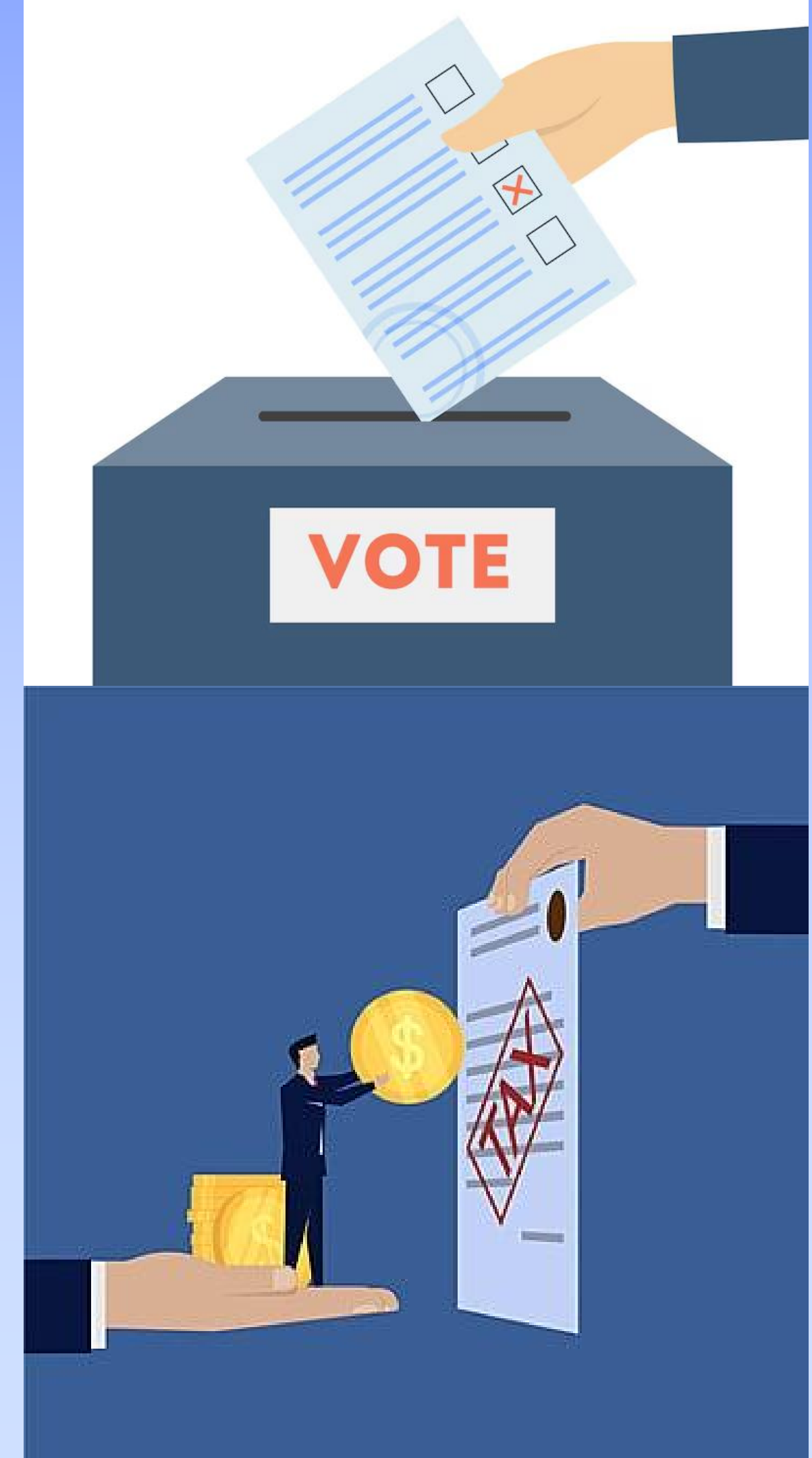

- **What is the difference between nationalism and patriotism?**

NATIONALISM

- Loyalty to a nation
- Pride in the nation regardless of its actions; a focus on shared identity (pride in who we are).

NATIONALISM

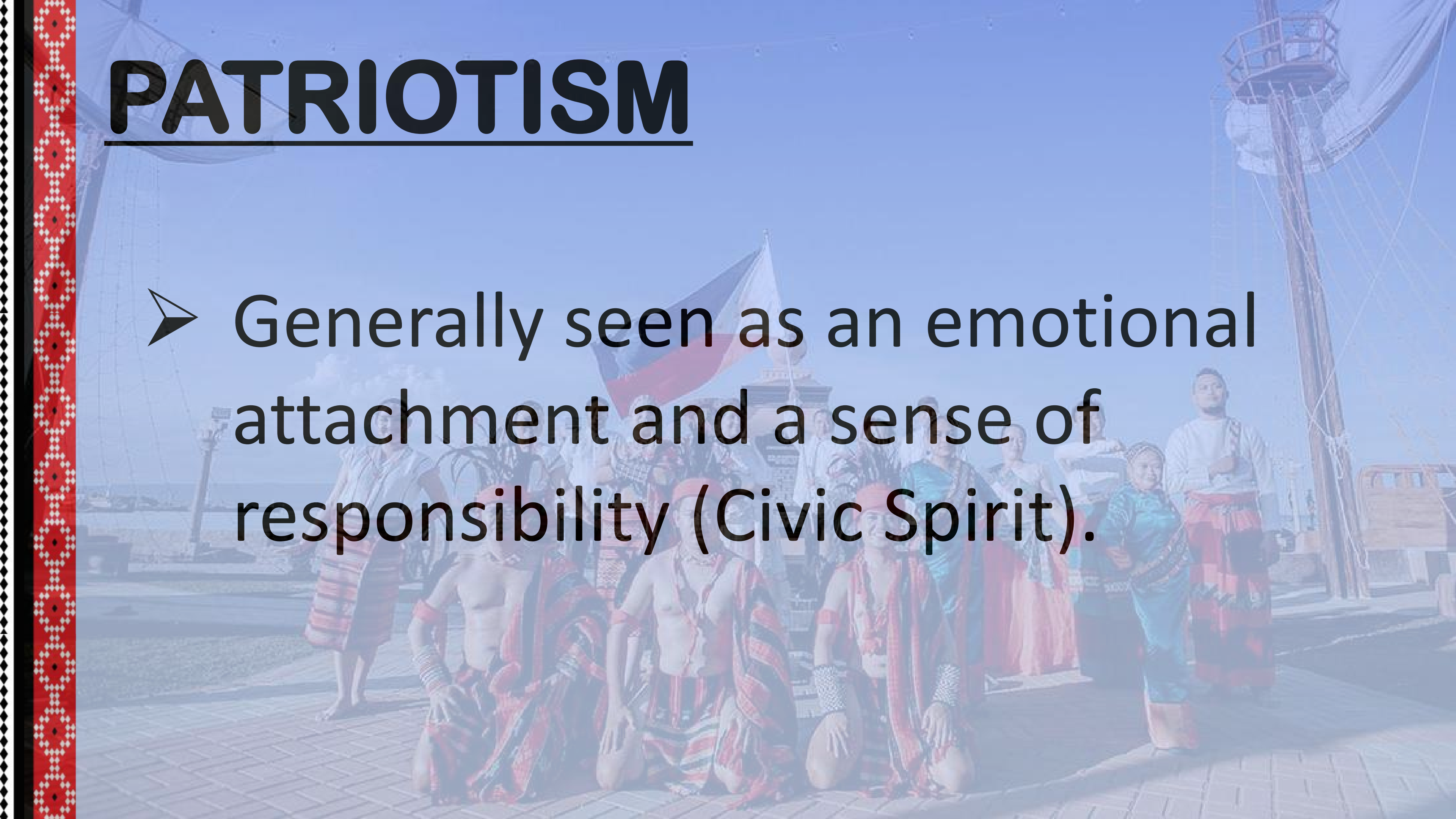
- An ideology and a political movement focused on the interests of the nation (often tied to National Identity).

PATRIOTISM

- Love of country
- Pride in a country's values, institutions, and achievements (pride in what it does).

PATRIOTISM

- Generally seen as an emotional attachment and a sense of responsibility (Civic Spirit).



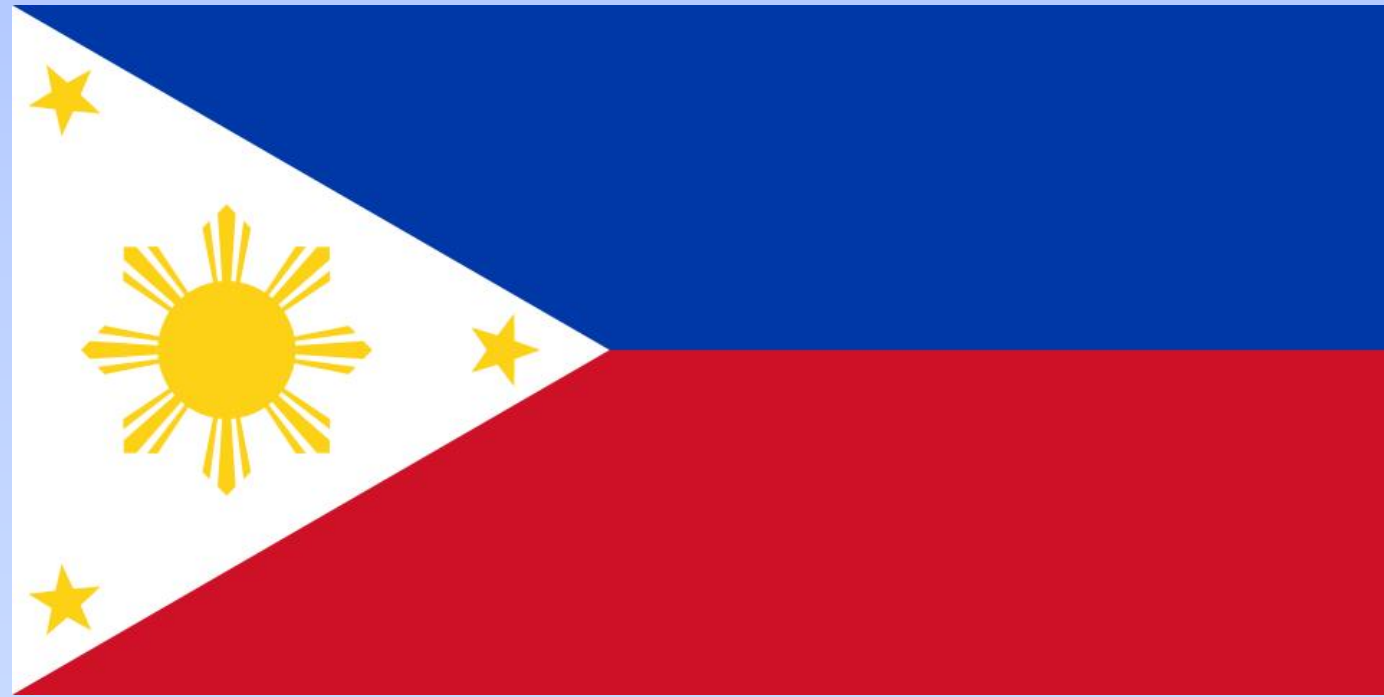
Nationalistic Music

- is a compositional movement that uses musical ideas to express national identity, often by incorporating folk tunes, historical themes, and regional styles.

Patriotic Music

- is a broad category of musical compositions that simply express love, devotion, support, and pride for one's country.
- It is more about emotional connection and civic duty than the stylistic or political assertion of identity found in nationalism.

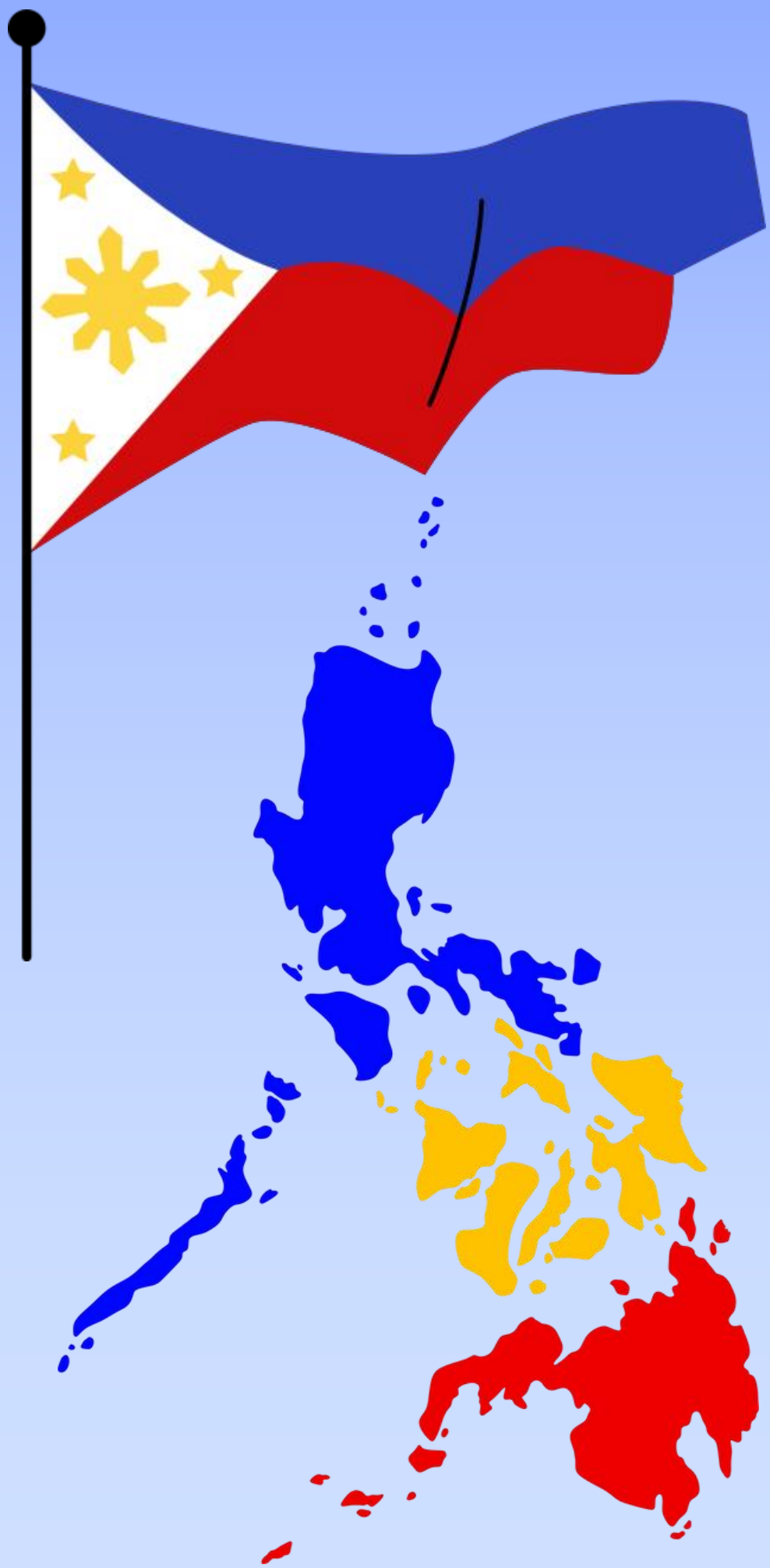

Lupang Hinirang (Chosen Land)

- also known as “*Marcha Nacional Filipina*” or “*Himno Nacional Filipina*”
- Music composed by Julián Felipe in 1898.
- The lyrics were adopted from the Spanish poem “Filipinas”, written by José Palma in 1899.
- The national anthem’s last revision was made in 1962.

- 
- *Lupang Hinirang* is sung with pride, dignity, utmost respect, and allegiance to the country.
 - The singing and playing of the Philippine national anthem is governed by the law, specifically R.A. 8491 or the “Flag and Heraldic Code of the Philippines.”

- 
- As stipulated in Section 37, “The rendition of the National Anthem, whether played or sung, shall be in accord with the musical arrangement and composition of Julian Felipe” (Filipinas Heritage Library, 2018).

- Time Signature: 2/4
- Downward beat
